Who are we?

Telford Family Learning promotes an enthusiasm for learning by encouraging families to learn together.

"If you raise parents aspirations, you raise children's aspirations!"

On our courses, adults (mothers, fathers, grandparents, carers etc) work with children to:

- Offer ideas to encourage mothers, fathers etc to help support their child's learning. Children can be ages from 0 to 16;
- Improve the English, Maths, Language and ICT skills of parents;
- Support the children's acquisition of English, Maths and Language.

Most of our courses are delivered in Telford schools but courses can be run from a range of community venues and Children's centres in Telford.

What do we do?

We run a broad range of programmes, some short (10 hours) and some much longer (up to 40 hours). Most courses offer progression from introductory courses to accredited programmes where people can gain a nationally recognized qualification. There are, however common themes that all Family Learning courses will include:

- Designed to be fun, enjoyable and stimulating;
- Run by very experienced, qualified teachers or tutors who are experts at engaging adults and children;
- Related, supportive and individually tailored to the needs of the group;
- Free Crèche provided on all courses, according to demand.

All our courses have English, Maths and ICT embedded and can be tailored to meet the needs of the setting.

Short Courses

These courses normally last for 10 to 20 hours and parents and their children work together throughout or for part of the session.

Longer Courses

These courses last between 20 to 40 hours and learners can achieve a nationally recognized qualification.

In addition to the above, we run "Keeping up with the Children" programmes that help parents understand how their children are taught in school by introducing them to the terminology used, giving examples of work done in class etc. For this programme, parents are taught without their children present.

Parents have the opportunity to achieve Functional Skills qualifications in English and Maths. There are also Open College Network West Midlands courses, which offer opportunities to achieve a Qualification at Level 1 and level 2.
