


# Woodies' Readers

Can you guess who these book corners belong to? Remember, lots of teachers have moved year groups.






## Reading Club!


## RE Day in Y2!







#### You've had great success with the Who Let The Gods Out, Vi Spy and Scarlett Fife series – what's coming next?

You're very kind! Next year is very exciting for me, as I have three books out! The final Scarlett book, The Stormy Life of Scarlett Fife, is out in May, then I have two top-secret projects out later in the year.

I'm not allowed to say too much, but I hope that fans of my Who Let The Gods Out? series will be happy...

#### How do you come up with such amazing ideas?


Haha! not all my ideas are amazing, let me tell you! Ideas are a funny business – you can sit for hours straining to have one, then a really good one just pops into your head when you're in the supermarket!

I think the key is to be ready to recognise them and catch them with your net – and always write books that you would want to read yourself.

#### You do a lot of work with schools as well. Is that fun?

It's great fun! Meeting my readers and making new ones is one of the very best bits of my job. It's been so annoying not to be able to get out and about thanks to silly Covid, but I'm very happy to be back on the road this year.

Why are books and reading so important for children,



#### especially when they have so much technology fighting for their attention?

I think everything in life is about balance. There's nothing wrong with screens, but you have to do other things too.

Reading grows your mind and your heart – and it's just a scientific fact that people who read more do better in this life. And what's nicer than curling up with a good book – lovely!

#### What were your own favourite books as a child?

Like many people my age, I was a massive fan of Roald Dahl as a kid.

Learning more about him as an adult, I don't think he and I would have seen eye-to-eye, but I can't deny the huge impact his books had on me as a child and as a writer.

His books are funny, but have some serious points to make. I try to do the same

#### What other children's authors do you admire?

So many! I'm great friends with MG Leonard and Lisa Thompson, whose books are just incredible.

This is a tough business, so people who have been doing it for a long time, like Cressida Cowell, Malorie Blackman or Frank Cottrell Boyce, have my huge admiration. And really anyone who is trying to inspire young minds – what a great thing to do.

#### Finally, what advice would you give children who find writing a challenge?

I promise you, you can do it. It's like anything – some people just find it harder than others.

And it's all about practice. I can't kick a football to save my life, but if I did a bit every day, I'd get a lot better very quickly. Writing is the same – a little bit every day and you will get there, I promise.

## Some reminders...

At Woodlands, we encourage children to read as often as possible to further encourage a love of reading.

Every time your child's/children's reading diary is signed by an adult at home, we reward them with a raffle ticket.

Every term, the raffle is drawn and a winner is chosen from each class, winning either a book voucher or a book of their choice.

The next draw will take place next academic year, before we break up for the Christmas Holidays.


## Books For Topics!


# Events coming up to further promote a love of reading...
