many of our 'secrets of success' throughout the morning. Quidditch will be an after school club next half term, so keep your eyes peeled for it!












This week, Miss Whale had the pleasure of taking our recorder club, to the recorder festival in Oakengates.

Year 2 will be the next year group to host a Stay and Learn event!


